EUDOSHIN DOJO AN EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATIONI

The Budoshin Ju-Jitsu Dojo is now Budoshin Ju-Jitsu Dojo Inc., a non-profit, tax-deductible educational foundation. This effort took several months and was accomplished at the suggestion of the dojo's insurance agent [to reduce insurance costs & liability] and with the assistance of the Calif. Dept. of Corporations and IRS, which gave some good advice on which direction to take in securing a 501[c][3] status.

What did this get for the dojo? It kept insurance costs from doubling or tripling for most students. It allows any of the three instructor to teach any of the other's classes at the Burbank Park facility without increased personal liability. It makes it possible to get free advertising spots on radio & possibly community cable TV. The dojo can now accept any monetary donations and the donors can write it off their taxes.

Was it expensive? The entire cost, including filing fees, etc., was in excess of \$500. Not cheap. But will will save the dojo and the students considerable money in the future.




GET Your national awards NOMINATION FORMS MAILED

If you are a sensei and you haven't received your nomination forms, contact Julio Usera at [605] 342-7717. He'll even FAX them to you.










HAR-BRO DOJOTREE

Teaching Philosophy:
To be hard when the situation requires hardness, bending when it is in your best interest to bend. A stress of basic ukemi-waza, nage-waza, geriwaza, and zuki-waza. Traditional goshinjutsu, use of the weapons of the samurai, sword and short staff. A can-do approach. The ground is your friend.

Comments: We need to keep traditional aspects of the art alive while maintaining ecletic American styles.

SEKIRYU

ART OR WAY ?

The Bugei or "Martial Arts" of Japan are not to be confused with Budo or "Martial Way". They are quite unlike in purpose, nature, and technique. The Bugie arts include, what is known as Jitsu forms, those systems that end in Jitsu, ie; Kenjitsu, Bojitsu, Jojitsu, ninjitsu, laijitsu.

The Budo forms are laido, Kendo, Judo, Aikido, and are largely a 20 th century development. The Budo arts are more concerned with spiritual discipline, which could elevate oneself mentally and physically.

The Bugei forms were developed largely as a protection, and for developing the mind and technical skills to help defend ones superiors, family and love ones.

Bugie arts have a very wide spectrum of learning, like Senjo-Jitsu "N-EdfhAWarrior deployment N-EdfhB", or Chihujo-Jitsu "N-EdfhAFortification N-EdfhB", because they were all for COMBAT.

The Budo arts are more for "Higher Aims" than for combat. Now days more and more Budo arts are going the way of competition, which is considered by many Jitsu instructors, to lose its effectiveness in combat. The more remote a Budo form remains from a sport, the more positively it reinforces the combat effectiveness of its art.

Any Jitsu form which uses the kyu/dan ranking, is not considered a classical Jitsu form. There are some exceptions to this rule. Those are where a kyu/dan ranking is handed out by the head Instructor of the RYU, who uses no preset test for rank. Rather a student is graded by his actions, self-respect, knowledge and the willingness to pass on the art to others. In this respect the ranking are more like a Menko-Licence system than a kyu/dan ranking system.

With most Budo ranking systems, Prestige and Title are more important than the teaching of the system.

As a last note on ranking, my Teacher who would never let himself be called a MASTER, because if you were a MASTER you were almost *DEAD*. Also he was always saying, You start out a white belt, at each level you are then a white belt, and at the time of your death you are still a white belt----JUST LEARNING.
