Israeli Ju-Jitsu Visit To England

The visit was arranged and the itinerary organised by COLIN WHITAKER, PRESIDENT of the AMATEUR MARTIAL ASSN, & the WORLD COUNCIL OF JU-JITSU ORGANISATIONS, & the JU-JUTSUKAN MARTIAL ARTS CLUB, LEEDS. The IJJFCA are members of the WCJJO & AMA.

The exchange visit was scheduled to last from July 3rd to 10th and a highly successful and revarding visit it turned out to be.

The visiting group consisted of four instructors, MATI ELYASH V 4th Dan, OREN GORGOV 3rd Dan, ABRAHAM ELIYAHU 3rd Dan, & HARET KATZ 1st Dan, plus ten students between the ages of 13 & 17. The group were met at Heathrow Airport at 12 noon on the 3rd July and taken on a mini tour of LONDON, and then onto LEEDS. The bus and driver were hired for their use for the full week. On arriving they were taken to the Leeds dojo and introduced to the instructors and students. Then off to the Beechwood Hotel to unpack, relax, and sleep after their long journey.

JUDO TECHNIQUE

KATATE SEOI NAGE (One Arm Shoulder Throw)

There are several variations (henka) to Katate Seoi Nage, often called Ippon Seoi Nage. This throw brings the uke over in the largest possible curve. The uke when so thrown knows that he has been really thrown. The feeling is like a leaf falling from the branch of a tree. To execute the projection throw effectively you must first "fish" up the uke straight to the front or right front. Spin the whole body with your back pressed tightly against uke's chest. Thrus: your right arm and hand up at a right angle under uke's right arm pit.

The throwing action varies. If the $\underline{v}\underline{k}\underline{e}$ is tall and heavy use a pulling $(\underline{h}\underline{k}\underline{k})$ action. If the $\underline{u}\underline{k}\underline{e}$ is about your size push $(\underline{osu-na})$ with your hips. See diagram below.

Helpful hints:

- 1. During the execution do not throw your body forward.
- The pulling action of your left hand, arm and shoulder must be constant until the uke falls on the mats.
- Your knees must be bent and legs spread shoulder width. This
 posture takes practice to develop. The feet should not be too wide
 apart for a strong throw.
- Hold your head straight with your neck muscles taunt. <u>Do not turn</u> your face up. <u>Never let the head fall back</u>.
- To master this throw you must do at least 500 deep knee bends daily. I suggest 100 in sets of five. These may be done with a belt (obi) against a tree.
- 6. Your movement must be relaxed and dominating to avoid the counter.
